RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

VenuesWest is committed to providing a safe and enjoyable environment for all patrons and staff. By entering this venue you agree to comply and cooperate with the Venue Rules, Conditions of Entry, and Craft Flow Plan. VenuesWest reserves the right to remove or refuse entry of patrons who do not comply with these conditions.

Any visitor who carries out any of the listed prohibited activities will be asked to leave Champion Lakes Regatta Centre immediately and may be reported to the WA Police.

Dogs

To help look after water quality, dogs are permitted at Champion Lakes Regatta Centre if the following conditions are satisfied:

- · Dogs must be on a leash
- · Dogs must be kept under control
- · Dogs are prohibited from wading and swimming in the lakes
- Dog owners must collect their dogs' faeces and deposit in the receptacles provided
- · Cyclists, skaters, and vehicle drivers must not lead or be towed by dogs

Motorists

Motor vehicles must:

- · Remain on sealed roads and be driven in accordance with all signs
- Be parked in designated parking areas in accordance with signs, not on any other areas, including any grass areas unless otherwise indicated by a sign or requested by a VenuesWest authorised person
- Not be used to tow or push skaters or cyclists

Cyclists and Skaters

All cyclists and skaters must:

- · Wear a helmet whenever cycling or skating
- · Obey the direction indicated on travel signs
- Keep left on the cycle path unless otherwise indicated by a sign or requested by a VenuesWest authorised person
- · Cycle or skate (as the case may be) no more than two people side by side
- \cdot Not hang on to any motor vehicle to be towed or pushed

The following are strictly prohibited:

- · Powered craft (motorboats/jet skis)
- · Wind powered craft (sailing boats, kite-boards and windsurfing boards)
- · Indecent, obscene, insulting or threatening language
- · Offensive or indecent behaviour
- · Failure to comply with a reasonable request from a Champion Lakes Regatta Centre or VenuesWest authorised person
- · Depositing any domestic or industrial waste
- · Leaving any litter except in the litter receptacles provided
- · Polluting water
- Driving, riding or parking any vehicle, including motor vehicles, bicycles or skates on any grassed or landscape area unless otherwise indicated by a sign or requested by a VenuesWest authorised person
- · Driving, riding, parking or acting in a manner contrary to any signs
- · Abandoning any vehicle
- · Damaging, destroying or removing any grass area, tree, plant or other vegetation
- · Digging or defacing any rocks
- $\cdot \ \mathsf{Damaging}, \ \mathsf{destroying} \ \mathsf{or} \ \mathsf{removing} \ \mathsf{any} \ \mathsf{building}, \ \mathsf{structure} \ \mathsf{or} \ \mathsf{equipment}$
- · Capturing, annoying, injuring, killing or otherwise interfering with any animal
- · Interfering in any way with any habitat
- · Causing a nuisance through the use of any broadcasting equipment
- \cdot Protesting and exhibiting protest banners that are offensive to other users
- · Playing or practising golf
- \cdot Lighting a fire or barbeque heat beads however, the use of portable gas cooking equipment is acceptable
- · Discharging fireworks
- Carrying or discharging or otherwise having within one's possession or control any firearm or any other weapon including knives
- \cdot Having any animal other than dogs
- · Camping or residing within Champion Lakes Regatta Centre
- · Throwing rocks into the lakes
- · Entering areas that are fenced off, locked or closed to the public
- \cdot Obstructing an authorised person from performing duties
- Having any glassware items (outside of designated licensed areas). Please note that Champion Lakes Regatta Centre is a glass free zone. Venue Management reserve the right to check bags as a Condition of Entry.
- \cdot Teaching any person how to drive a car or ride a motorcycle
- \cdot Fishing in the lakes

Visitors may suffer injury or death as a result of participating in any recreational activities at Champion Lakes Regatta Centre. Visitors participate in recreational activities at Champion Lakes Regatta Centre at their own risk. Champion Lakes Regatta Centre has unfenced access to the lakes, cycle and pedestrian paths that at times are used by vehicles. Parents supervise children at all times.

The following activities are strictly prohibited without prior written permission from VenuesWest:

- · Collection of money
- · Sale or hire of any goods or services
- · Conducting amusements, entertainment, venue tours or performances
- · Participating in any protest, march, demonstration or public meeting
- · Displaying or distributing any advertising or political material
- · Commercial filming (whether cinematic or video) or photography
- · Erection of any structures such as marquees, awnings, etc
- · Erection, placement or affixation of any banners or any signage
- · Use of any public address systems, including hand-held megaphones
- · Bathing, wading or swimming in areas of the lake other than the two designated public beaches adjacent to Henley Drive and within the residential development
- · Sailing
- · Windsurfing
- · Kite-boarding
- · Operation of motorised model aircrafts, boats or cars
- · Conducting any survey of visitors to the Champion Lakes Regatta Centre

Booked event activities have priority usage rights at Champion Lakes Regatta Centre

Champion Lakes Regatta Centre is a regional sporting venue and both the water body and surrounding pathways are utilised for competitive event activities. As both competitors and the public have access to pathways and the waterbody there is a risk to all competitors colliding with recreational craft or cycles. It is imperative that paddling craft utilise Champion Lakes Regatta Centre Craft Flow Plan whilst on the lake for training or recreational use to minimise the risk of collision. For pedestrians and cyclists, users are requested to keep left at all times and to be aware of major junctions, such as where the event path crosses Henley Drive near the Public Toilets and where crossovers have been provided to link the paths with roads. For booked events, organisers will determine their own flow plan and method to control access for recreational users of the lake and pathways.

Champion Lakes Regatta Centre's waterbody is monitored to ensure conditions meet health guidelines for recreational water activities. Visitors must adhere to "Lake Closed" signage when displayed.
